- VI. The Committee reviewed each section of the "Description of PCCLB Contractor Classifications" and unanimously accepted Management's proposed changes:
 - Change the title to PCCLB Contractor Classifications
 - Add the following preamble: The PCCLB licenses contractors in the following classifications to perform the work as defined below. The Board reserves the right to add or delete classifications in compliance with Florida statutes.
- VII. The Committee unanimously accepted as proposed the New Fees to include:
 - Section 8.05 and 8.07 Mail Processing Fee \$25.00

- Proposed New Fee: Under Section 11 of the New Special Act, the Board is authorized to establish "other such fees deemed necessary to accomplish the purposes of this act."
- Section 489.127(5)(n) provides: Nothing contained in this subsection shall prohibit a county or municipality from enforcing its codes or ordinances by any other means.
- Section 489.127(5)(b)(7) provides: A citation issued by a code enforcement officer shall be in a form prescribed by the local governing body of the county or municipality and shall state: (7) The applicable civil penalty if the person elects not to contest the citation.

 Recommended as per the fee schedule.
- Section 489.127(5)(d)(2) provides: The act for which the citation is issued shall be ceased upon receipt of the citation; and the person charged with the violation shall elect either to correct the violation and pay the civil penalty in the manner indicated on the citation or, within 10 days of receipt of the citation, exclusive of weekends and legal holidays, request an administrative hearing before the enforcement or licensing board or designated special magistrate to appeal the issuance of the citation by the code enforcement officer. 2. Failure of a violator to appeal the decision of the code enforcement officer within the time period set forth in this paragraph shall constitute a waiver of the violator's right to an administrative hearing. A waiver of the right to an administrative hearing shall be deemed an admission of the violation, and penalties may be imposed accordingly. Management recommends and The Committee unanimously accepted: A \$250 penalty when a violator either:
 - fails to timely contest the citation,
 - o or fails to voluntarily pay the fine as directed.

This amount helps offset the additional cost of case preparation, issuance and recording of a final order, and administrative and collection efforts. This additional penalty would also be added when a violator who contests a citation is found guilty of the act for which he/she was cited.
